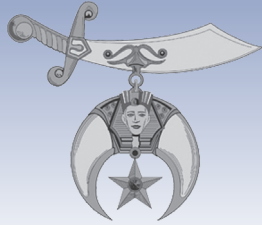

Recorder's Message...

Greetings Nobles and families!



Half of 2026 is now in the books. Again, this year as it seems every year, the days seem to be speeding along. I hope you are enjoying the beginning of Summer. Your Divan is preparing to depart for Tampa for the Imperial Session July 11 to the 16. Since the Imperial has moved away from the Independence Day holiday and we have our business continuing with meetings and rentals, we are not closing the Mizpah Offices and Center while the Divan is away. The office will be closed on JULY 2 in celebration of the Saturday, July 4 holiday.

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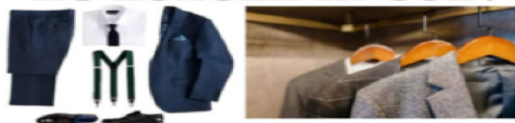
